Rock Platform / Dune and Beach risks	Sea creatures, insects, ticks and snakes present in the field resulting in Stings Bites	4	 Students are warned about dangerous animals and shown photos. Students are instructed not to put their hands in crevices or under rocks. If a dangerous creature is sighted tell a CEC Educator immediately. Insect repellent should be used when entering insect and tick prone areas. Closed in shoes must be worn and students to follow directions from CEC educators regarding safest route. Vehicle movements within public areas and on school grounds	CEC staff moving vehicles within public areas and school grounds to deliver equipment. Risk of injury to members of the public or school students	2	 No Vehicle will drive in a public area or school unless written permission is provided by the relevant authority or property manager No vehicle will enter school grounds during times when they are specifically excluded from the area All vehicles will travel at a speed no greater than 10Kph, or any sign posted speed limit All vehicles must drive with Hazard lights on All vehicles must have a member of staff or responsible adult walking ahead of the vehicle while moving. 	6	 CEC staff School staff Relevant property manager or Authority

All power cords are to be in locations where they present no trip hazard or are covered with an appropriate anti-trip product. Catastrophic Kill or permanent injury	1	1	2	3

Moderate Medical attention required	2	3	4	5

1 = Extreme risk: immediate action required

2 & 3 = High risk: action required

4 & 5 = Moderate risk: some action required 6 = Low Risk: some action may not be required
